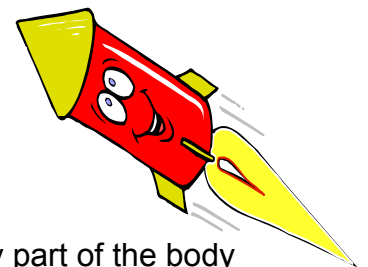
SIP TIP: FIREWORK SAFETY



It is extremely important to know the difference between a legal consumer firework and a dangerous explosive device. Items such as M-80s, M-100s and blockbusters are not fireworks, they are federally banned explosives.

If you choose to celebrate the Fourth of July with fireworks, check with your local police department to determine what fireworks can be legally discharged in your area. In addition, to help you celebrate safely this Fourth of July, **PLEASE** follow these safety tips:

-  Always read and follow label directions.
-  Have a responsible adult present.
-  Buy from reliable sellers.
-  Use outdoors only.
-  Always have water handy (a garden hose and a bucket).
-  Never experiment or make your own fireworks.
-  Light only one firework at a time.
-  Never re-light a "dud" firework (wait 15 to 20 minutes and then soak it in a bucket of water).
-  If necessary, store fireworks in a cool, dry place.
-  Dispose of fireworks properly by soaking them in water and then disposing of them in your trash can.
-  Never throw or point fireworks at other people.
-  Never carry fireworks in your pocket.
-  Never shoot fireworks in metal or glass containers.
-  The shooter should always wear eye protection and never have any part of the body over the firework.
-  Stay away from illegal explosives.
